## AK STEEL FUELS SIMON TO ANOTHER STOCK CONTEST VICTORY

For the second time in three years, AlphaMark Advisors founder and president Mike Simon has won the *Business Courier's* annual stock-picking contest.

Simon rode AK Steel Holding Corp.'s whopping 356 percent gain to an overall return of 76 percent in his portfolio of five stocks in the contest. Simon finished with a yawning lead over second-place finisher Buck Newsome of Cambridge Financial Group. Newsome's 52 percent gain would be a winner in most years but it was no match for Simon's performance.

Twenty-two contestants – 21 local investment advisers and the Courier – selected five stocks in early January 2016 that they expected to produce the best total return, including dividends, for the year. At least one selection had to be a locally based company.

Simon also won the contest in 2014, with a 31 percent return.

"Absolutely, it's very exciting," Simon told me. "Our clients like to hear about it and it's certainly a point of pride."

West Chester-based AK Steel led Simon's picks. The stock soared in March when the U.S. Department of Commerce said it would raise taxes on imported coldrolled steel. It gained another two-thirds in value after Election Day.
